Memo No. SMG. 1/72/112, dt. 28.11.72.— Dated Aizavi, the 18th November, 1972. No. MAP. 32/72/47— In the interest of service it often becomes necessary that the employees of the Govt. of Assam, who are posted in Mizorum for service in connection with the affairs of the Union Territory, before or from the 21st. January, 1972 be promoted to higher posts as and when necessary by the Government of Mizorum. Since such arrangements involve change in the terms and conditions of their service, the matter was discussed with the Government of Assam, and the said Government has no objection to the temporary promotions as a measure of local expediency subject to the condition that, such employees cranot claim any seniority and financial benefit on reversion to their parent service.

It has accordingly been decided that all such promotions of the employees of the Govt. of Assam, shall be treated as an adhoc basis and, as such it should be made clear to each promotee by inserting a clause in the order that such adhoc promotion shall not confer any right to claim seniority and financial benefits on reversion of the promotee to the Govt. of Assam, in his/her parent service.
